

Join Us to Move First Forward

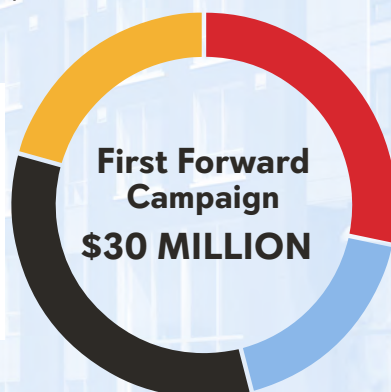
The redevelopment of our aging church building at 320 East Hastings into a multi-storey, multi-purpose facility that provides both critical support services and urgently needed housing has been in contemplation for many years.

Over the past five years, we engaged in several community consultation processes, conducted feasibility studies, formed a partnership with Lu'ma Native Housing Society, assembled a team of professional consultants, and developed preliminary plans for the building. In 2020, a \$10 million leadership gift gave us the resources needed to move the redevelopment of **FIRST UNITED** forward, and we submitted our development permit application in September 2020.

The project has received unanimous support so far from all levels of government throughout the design and regulatory process. With sufficient momentum built, we held our first meeting of the First Forward Cabinet in February 2021. Led by Honourary Chair Mike Harcourt and co-chairs Rudy Kerklaan and the Reverend Cari Copeman-Haynes, the Cabinet kicked off our First Forward Building Connections Campaign with the ambitious **goal of raising \$30 million to fund FIRST UNITED's portion of the redevelopment project.**

As the demolition and construction start at 320 East Hastings draws near, we're excited to announce that **our capital campaign has raised nearly \$22 million to date.** We've received overwhelming support from corporations, communities of faith, individuals, and the public sector. And on November 16th, we took the campaign public!

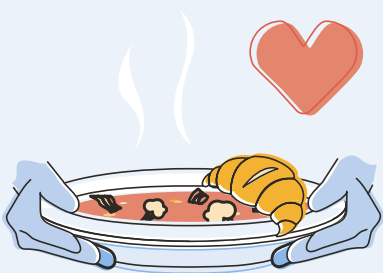
Introducing Food First

We are excited to be launching another new initiative that will enable us to continue serving hot, nutritious meals to our community in the DTES during the redevelopment of 320 East Hastings and beyond—**Food First**, the **FIRST UNITED** food truck meal program!

During the redevelopment, meals for our meal program will be prepared at a commissary kitchen on Clark Drive and then distributed to DTES residents via our new mobile food truck fleet, which consists of a minivan, a cargo van, and a fully-equipped food truck.

Our Food First food truck made its debut appearance at the First Forward campaign launch on November 16th. Keep an eye out for it around the DTES in early 2022!

Community Member Profile: Victor

We recently spoke to Victor, a community member who has used a variety of FIRST UNITED services like our meal program, community help desk, and shelter. Through our wraparound services, we were able to help Victor get permanently housed. For over 135 years we've been helping meet the most immediate and pressing needs of those in our community and we're proud to support our community members thrive and have long-term solutions. Find out about Victor's story:

"I'm blind in one eye and have relied on the use of a wheelchair for four years now to get around – due to instability in my joints and muscles, walking is a significant challenge, and my risk of falling is high. Because of my chair, I am not able to access many places, including most emergency shelters. I also require special, accessible housing.

Without FIRST UNITED, I'd really be screwed. Before coming to First, my health was at stake because I was receiving no support or care and was sleeping out on the street. **With their support, I was able to get off the streets and eventually find a place to live that could accommodate me and provide me with three meals per day.**"





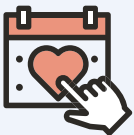
