Suggested Scripture - Mark 13:24-37

Lighting the Candle to Anticipate Hope

Leader: Advent is a time of anticipation and preparation! Stay alert!

All: Hope has always been here. Hope will arrive soon.

Leader: (lights first candle) We hear the voices of God's children crying out with hope in the words of Call to Justice #18.17

All: Hope has always been here. Hope will arrive soon. We hear the words of Your people. Stay alert!

Leader: "We call upon all governments, service providers, and educators to fund and support the re-education of communities and individuals who have learned to reject 2SLGBTQQIA people, or who deny their important history and contemporary place within communities and in ceremony, and to address transphobia and homophobia in communities (for example, with anti-transphobia and anti-homophobia programs), to ensure cultural access for 2SLGBTQQIA people."*

Leader: (lights fourth candle) From love, God made a covenant with us. Through love and solidarity, we live out that covenant together by keeping promises.

All: We are giving our labor, resources, and time.

Leader: (lights second candle) We are re-educating "communities and individuals who have learned to reject 2SLGBTQQIA people..."* for the witness of peacemaking.

All: We are giving our labor, resources, and time.

Leader: (lights third candle) We are joyfully re-educating communities and individuals who deny 2SLGBTQQIA people their "important history and contemporary place within communities and in ceremony..." *

All: We are giving our labor, resources, and time.

Leader: (lights fourth candle) We are dismantling "transphobia and homophobia in communities... to ensure cultural access for 2SLGBTQQIA people" for the building up of the community of love.*

All: We are giving our labor, resources, and time.

Leader: (lights Christ candle) We are completing the circle, celebrating Christ as our center. Joy to the world! Christ has come!

All: Advent hope, peace, joy, and love was always here.
